Friday 26 July Day six of the competition

The various weather services forecasting a rainy morning, but fortunately the rain didn't arrive. However, it rained heavily overnight and the ceiling was very low this Friday morning, resulting in a delay of almost an hour.

This was the second flight of the semi-finals, with the last pilot completing his flight at around 5.30pm.

The ten selected pilots are now known after this second semi-final flight.

At the top of the leaderboard, there are no surprises compared with the results of the preliminary flights. On points, 8% separate the tenth pilot selected from the leader.

It is remarkable to note that the three junior pilots on the podium in 2018, during the EC held at Grandrieu (Andreas Cervi (ITA), Ignace Pawlenko (BEL) and Omer Ben Ami (ISR)), are now competing in the senior category and are present in the top 30 in the same order. Better still, Andreas Cervi is 7th after the semi-final.

Let's hope that the three yound pilots in this edition (Oscar Henry (BEL), Andreas Psaltis (CYP) and Patrick Krautschneider (CZE)) will progress in the same way.
